Webelos Weekend is a one night camping experience for Webelos in the Iaoapogh Mountains district. This year's theme is:



## ***"PIRATES OF THE CAMPGROUND"***

Here's how it goes: Check in on Saturday morning and set up camp with your den/pack. After eating your bag lunch, convene at the amphitheater for the opening address. Then Webelos head to the ball field to participate in the round of activities that offer the opportunity to have fun while learning scout skills and completing a variety of requirements for Webelos activity badges (pins)!

Hint: Families and leaders that check the activity badge (pin) requirements in the Webelos Handbook ahead of time will find opportunities to complete virtually all of the Outdoorsman requirements as well as requirements for other activity pins on this trip. Remember that the Webelos should participate in the set-up of their campsite, laying and lighting of fires and cooking of meals (under adult guidance). Webelos who have already earned Outdoorsman will still have fun and gain valuable camping experience!

- Registration will be limited to the first 150 registered Webelos
- Parents or adult partners must participate in the overnight camping
- The cost per person is \$7.00 payable upon registration to "NNJC" -- put "account IMD 06-122" in the memo line so you are correctly credited for payment. Camperships are available!
- **To help us predict the magnitude of attendance, please notify Carol or Terry (see below) as to whether or not your unit plans to attend by Tuesday, September 10 with an estimated headcount. Start thinking now!**
- **Detailed Registration and Payment is due Friday, October 20 - see enclosed form**
- Troops are invited to run activities Saturday afternoon/eve and/or to camp Friday and/or Saturday
- **Webelos should plan to arrive by 9:30am Saturday morning; depart mid-morning on Sunday**

## General Information

- Bring a bag lunch for Saturday. Cook dinner Saturday and breakfast Sunday. Depart Sunday mid-morning after a brief assembly and non-denominational service.
- **Each den should prepare a skit or song for the campfire Saturday night.** Feel free to use the Pirate theme in your den or pack's skit!
- Carry a minimal amount of gear with you. Leave extra stuff in the car.
- Webelos Scouts must not play with knives nor touch axes.
- Plan on sleeping in tents you bring.
- Dens supply their own food and equipment; there is typically a picnic table at each site.
- Adults must not sleep in tents with Scouts that are not their sons (following Youth Protection guidelines found in [Guide to Safe Scouting](#)).
- Bring a fishing rod if you like to fish (catch & release – no fishing from beach area).
- All garbage should be carried back home - there is no dumpster or facility for garbage at the camp.
- Webelos Scouts and Adult Partners only - no siblings.
- Scouts should have uniforms for the Campfire and Sunday service.
- There is a combination lock at the entrance. You must know the combination to get in...and out! This will be distributed the week before Webelos Weekend via email to the person submitting registration form (be sure to include email on registration form). Please lock the gate behind you.
- **Webelos scouts should plan to arrive by 9:30 am on Saturday.**
